Moses Lake to Add 5th Resident Owned Community

The Upper Lakeshore Homeowner's Cooperative elected a Board of Directors on February 11, 2018. The new board signed a Purchase and Sale Agreement and begins work on turing the twenty-five unit manufactured home park into a resident owned community. The process should take approximately three months. ULHC will be the fifth housing cooperative (ROC) in Moses Lake and the 14th in the State of Washington.





Sociocracy Leadership Training Program Seeks Co-op Participants

<u>Sociocracy For All (SoFa)</u>, an internationally focused organization that promotes the practice of sociocratic decision-making seeks participants for the seventh cohort of the <u>Sociocracy</u> <u>Leadership Training</u> program. This nine week program provides an opportunity to learn sociocrcacy while practicing the decision-making model. Participants from across the globe work in circles of six on various projects with a trainer producing materials to further promote or educate about Sociocracy. Two of NWCDC's specialists have participated. Circles meet for 1-2 hours a week via the internet and commit to tasks between the meetings. The training fee has a sliding scale of \$220-\$400. SoFA is specifically interested in people with a cooperative orientation who seek a governance model aligned with cooperative values and principles.

Washington Senate Learns About the Cooperative Difference

NWCDC organized and participated in a workshop for the **Washington State Senate Eonomic Development and International Trade Committee** chaired by Senator Marilyn Chase (D-32). The workshop focused on cooperatives for economic sustainability. Representatives from electric utiliies, agriculture, housing, and worker co-ops shared stories of their co-op's impacts on members and their communities. Senator Chase asked NWCDC to coordinate the presentation to educate the committee and policy makers on the power of co-operatives. The workshop will be available for the general public on <u>TVW</u>, Washington State's Public Affairs Network.
