## Predevelopment Loan Approved for Upper Lakeshore

Upper Lakeshore Homeowners Cooperative in Moses Lake, Washington is on track to purchasing the land under their homes. The community has been approved for a pre-development loan from ROC Capital allows the co-op to complete an engineers



report and acquire an appraisal. Both are key to getthing them that much closer to preserving 24 affordable homes indefinitely. Last weekend the Membership met at the Fire Station to give input on their community rules. In two weeks, rules and bylaws will be voted on by the membership, offering residents the power to steer the way on the journey ahead of their hopeful resident owned community.

### **Rural Oregon Initiative Grant to Assist WTV Truckers**

The funds will help support a project coordinator to work with the co-op's board to acquire group purchasing discounts (a member benefit), access to contracts, and develop materials to facilitate a strong membership drive. NWCDC will also work with the project coordinator to update the business plan, the strategic plan, and conduct training for the board and new co-op members.

### Port Townsend Co-op Academy Begins April 25

The second edition of the NWCDC Co-op Academy begins next week in Port Townsend. With assistance from the **Olympic Cooperative Network**, the US Federation of Worker Cooperatives, and the Democracy at Work Network, NWCDC will conduct a 10-week bootcamp for four cooperative projects on the Olympic Peninsula. This includes a conversion of an existing business and three new cooperatives. Almost 20 people have registered for the dasses.

#### More Interns at NWCDC

Spring Quarter is underway at **The Evergreen State College** and NWCDC benefits once more from the school's incredible students. A total of four interns have begun working this quarter (two of whom also interned in the Winter Quarter). All four completed the class on Worker Cooperatives taught last summer by NWCDC staff member, John McNamara. They will be working on a variety of projects including analyzing a feasibility study for **Affiliated Tribes of Northwest Indians**, researching data on opioid use in rural communities as part of a larger effort to understand how cooperatives may help abate that crisis, assisting with teaching in the Co-op Academy, and many other projects. NWCDC's continued partnership with TESC has been beneficial for the Center, the college, and the students.
