Recruitment Drive Begins for Co-op Acupuncture School

POCA Tech, a cooperatively owned and managed acupuncture school in Portland seeks members of it 5th Cohort. The tech school is a project of POCA Cooperative, a multi-stakeholder cooperative with the mission to work cooperatively to increase accessibility to and availability of affordable group acupuncture treatments. POCA Tech is a financially-reasonable acupuncture school dedicated to graduating students prepared to treat their

community with dignity, trauma-informed care, and a deep commitment to making acupuncture accessible to all. POCA Tech found out about NWCDC by attending

Spokane Tribe Federated Co-op



NWCDC has been working with the staff of the Chewelah Casino (owned by the Spokane Tribe of Indians). The development of that project has expanded to consider a larger project involving using arable land on the reservation, creating coops to provide youth employment and leadership development, and connecting the various stakeholders of the Tribal economy: Tribe members, Tribe descendants, employees of the Tribe. Food Sovereignty continues to be a key goal for the project along with creating a stronger local economy.

NWCDC Spring Retreat

In June, the staff of NWCDC met near Boston Harbor to discuss the upcoming year of cooperative and ROC Development. NWCDC expects to provide support for over 50 co-op projects in the coming year including continued technical assistance for the existing Resident Owned Communities, continuing work with 3 Tribe based enterprises, developing up to four new home care cooperatives, 4-5 conversions, and three tech co-ops (including a broadband internet service provider). New communities for NWCDC will include Port Angeles, Aberdeen in Washington and Clatskanie in Oregon. In addition, NWCDC will also be developing more Spanish language based development and outreach tools including a concentrated effort to educate financial advisers on co-operatives as an option for business succession planning. 2019 promises to be an exciting year as NWCDC continues to meet its mission of fostering community economic development through the cooperative business model.
