NWCDC and WSBDC Make Joint presentation to WA Senate



Duane Fladland, State Director Washington Small Business Development Centers, and Cindy Brooks of the Mt. Vernon SBDC office joined NWCDC Executive Director Diane Gasaway in a presentation for the Washington State Senate Economic Development and International Trade Committee. NWCDC was invited to the Committee's fall workshop to provide an update on co-op development in the state. The presentation focused on the goal of the Legacy Project that aims to ensure potential employee ownership discussions are discussed as retiring small business owners explore exit strategies and the recent passage of the Main Street Employee Ownership Act. Both organizations are concerned with building a vibrant Washington economy and shared how they are working together to provide technical assistance in ways that benefit everyone involved, thereby, increasing the capacity of rural communities to realize successful co-op conversions and start-ups.
