Virtual Incubator Coming Soon

NWCDC switches most of its network to the doud in the coming weeks through Google Suites. One of the benefits of this change will allow NWCDC to offer a virtual business incubator to dients. Client organizations may easily establish an on-line presence and gain access to business specific email and a suite of doud based software. Daniel Arrañaga, who spearheaded this effort, noted, "The integration of Gsuite for businesses will allow for greater collaboration and increase our ability to work remotely with many of our resident owned communities which are scattered throughout Washington State." In addition, NWCDC staff can assist in administration of the services. This will allow emerging cooperatives to set p quickly and help grow their business in a supportive environment.

CTAP Exchange Program

NWCDC stafferSam Green participated in the first leg of a CTAP exchange program through ROC USA. Same visited the offices of ROC New Hampshire which has a portfolio of 123 resident owned communities. He engaged in five days of training including remote and on-site technical assistance, learned about their best practices, observed processes, and gained new insights into the CTAP profession.

Home Care Co-ops

While NWCDC's service area focuses on the Pacific Northwest states of Idaho, Oregon, and Washington, we often get requests for assistance from across the country. With the growing interest in home care, Deborah Craig has found herself working with groups in Vermont and North Carolina. Both communities are looking towards creating caregiver owned co-ops to meet the growing demand for home care in their communities and provide better care for the caregivers through control of the work life.

The <u>Rick Merrill Memorial Fund</u> has been established to support home care development work of the <u>Cooperative Development Foundation</u>. Rick Merrill suffered a traumatic brain injury that led to a constant need for home care in 2005 and recently passed away. Judy Ziewacz, President and CEO of <u>NCBA/CLUSA</u>, created the fund in her husband's name to underscore the importance of supported caregivers noting, "For the past twelve years, caring, reliable home care provided peace of mind and improved quality of life for both Rick and me."
